Keynote Speaker – Dr. Jody Carrington (Swift Current)



Bestselling Author Dr. Jody Carrington is a renowned psychologist and a charismatic keynote speaker celebrated for her profound expertise in human connections. As a leading authority in addressing complex, human-centred challenges, Dr. Carrington excels in guiding individuals and organizations through the intricacies of re-establishing relationships in today's increasingly disconnected society. She boldly believes that all humans have the capacity for good; however, so many of us these days, because of isolation and burnout, have lost access to that good.

Through her insightful analysis, Dr. Carrington explores how societal detachment occurs and outlines practical, meaningful solutions for reconnection. Her approach combines a deeper understanding of how necessary acknowledgment has become, and she underscores how this need is so much bigger than recognition. Her dynamic and heartfelt presentations, infused with humor and honesty, captivate and energize audiences worldwide.

She is the Founder and Principal Psychologist at Carrington & Company. She has served as a civilian member of Canada's national police force, the RCMP, and practiced with the most complex cases on a psychiatric inpatient unit. Dr. Jody's balance as a devoted practitioner and brilliant communicator result in an ability to authentically connect through impactful presentations that has set a new bar in talking about the shifting landscape of mental health.

Dr. Jody has authored three best-selling books, including *Feeling Seen* (Harper Collins, 2022) and hosts the widely celebrated podcast, "Unlonely." From major theatres and convention halls of 5,000 attendees, to boardrooms of 20 senior leaders, she revels in connecting and delighting an audience of any size, championing the profound need for genuine human connection in an era often dominated by digital communication. Her work is trusted by many of the world's Fortune 500 companies, professional sports teams, education and healthcare leaders, all working to solve similar core challenges in creating a new set of rules to support and motivate their teams.



Keynote Speaker-Marc Y Tassé-MBA, FCPA, FCA, FCG, CFF (Capital A)



An award-winning lecturer at the University of Ottawa's Faculty of Law and at the Telfer Executive MBA program, Mr. Tassé has also delivered lectures on corporate ethics and financial crimes, at some of the world's premier universities such as McGill University and Harvard University.

Over the past 30 years, Mr. Tassé has taught over 8,500 university law and business students and also trained over 40,000 legal and business professionals across Canada and internationally. In addition, he has researched and developed numerous accredited professional development programs for legal and business professionals, as well as developed new courses for Law and MBA students.

Mr. Tassé examines domestic and transnational economic and financial crimes from different angles, and explores what motivates people to break the law, how wrongdoers cover their tracks, what can be done to put a stop to the looting, and the importance of Artificial Intelligence, Data Analytics and Machine Learning for fraud/corruption prevention and detection.

As a thought leader in the field of anti-corruption, Mr. Tassé was selected as a knowledge partner for the 2020 OECD Global Anti-Corruption & Integrity Forum, to present a research paper

on "Re-imagining Corporate Punishment on a Multilateral Scale".

He has since been selected to present further research on the topic of tackling corruption via Supranational mechanisms at an Anti-Corruption Symposium, to be hosted by the World Bank Office of Suspension and Debarment, the OECD, and the American Society of International Law in April 2022.

Mr. Tassé was also selected in 2020 to participate in the academic roundtable discussions organized by the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), to provide advice to the G20 Anti-Corruption Ministerial Working Group.

Mr. Tassé's current research focuses on the actual and potential effects of allegations of corruption and improper financial reporting on publicly-traded company's market capitalization.

Other areas of interest for Mr. Tassé are the trends in class action litigation in the context of white collar and corporate crime, as well as the reputational risks faced by national and international corporations and their directors.

He is a recipient of the King Charles III Coronation Medal for his significant contributions in his field.



Session – Ethical Behaviour and Ethical Leadership: Building Trust, Courage, and Accountability in Education

In today's increasingly complex educational environment, ethical leadership is not simply a desirable quality — it is an essential responsibility. School business officials play a critical role in shaping organizational culture, strengthening public trust, and ensuring that decisions are guided by integrity, fairness, transparency, and accountability.

This keynote session will explore the practical meaning of ethical behaviour and ethical leadership in the education sector. It will examine how leaders can navigate competing pressures, respond to ethical dilemmas with courage, and foster a culture where doing the right thing becomes the standard rather than the exception. Participants will gain insights into the connection between personal values, professional conduct, governance, reputation, and long-term organizational resilience.

Designed for leaders operating in environments of heightened scrutiny and limited resources, this session will provide a thought-provoking and practical discussion on how ethical leadership can inspire confidence, strengthen decision-making, and create lasting impact within schools and school divisions.

Scott stumbled his way into the world of privacy when co-leading the development of the Privacy and Access in Saskatchewan Schools website, while working for the Saskatchewan School Boards Association on behalf of a multi-stakeholder committee. He's been fascinated by the topic ever since and for nearly 10 years led communications and conducted policy research for the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner of Alberta (Alberta OIPC). With respect to K-12 education issues, Scott represented the Alberta OIPC on the Global Privacy Assembly's Digital Education Working Group, resulting in co-authoring a resolution on e-learning platforms; partnered on a University of Ottawa research project that looked into how networked spaces affect young people's views on privacy; and worked with school division privacy officers on a provincial approach to assessing educational apps.

Scott has a Master of Administration (Leadership) from the University of Regina, a Bachelor of Communications Studies from the University of Calgary and is a Certified Information Privacy Manager with the International Association of Privacy Professionals. Scott is now based in Saskatoon and combines his communications and policy expertise to help organizations with their privacy and AI governance challenges.



Felice McKay has worked in Saskatchewan's education sector for nearly 20 years in roles supporting students, educators, and communities. She currently serves as the Strategic Advisor – Indigenous Education with the Saskatchewan School Boards Association. She holds a bachelor's degree in Indigenous Studies, a master's certificate in public management, and a master's degree in public administration—educational experiences that have helped her build a balanced understanding of Indigenous knowledge systems and public sector work. A member of the George Gordon First Nation, she continues to live and work in Treaty 4 territory and is committed to advancing reconciliation and educational equity.

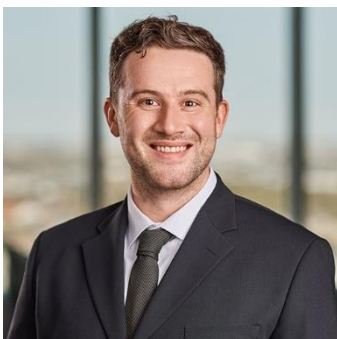
The Legal Issues in Education presentation provides an overview of the Saskatchewan School Boards Association's Legal, Employee, and Labour Relations Services and their role in supporting boards of education across the province. The session highlights key legal trends affecting school divisions, including labour and employment law, collective bargaining, human rights, workplace investigations, and essential services. Attendees will also gain practical insight into wrongful dismissal liability and insurance coverage considerations, as well as emerging issues in immigration law as it relates to employment in the education sector.

Layers of Complexity: AI Governance in Education-It is cliché to say that there is rarely a one-size-fits-all approach to addressing the opportunities and challenges of school divisions. But it's true and it applies to AI too. Consider students wearing AI-powered glasses in schools, the discussions about student assessments being conducted orally to stem AI-generated content, or the myriad safety issues that have arisen with the use of GenAI. When you do, the business-as-usual uses like getting AI to help draft policy documents or using AI-enabled software to scan job applications seem rather ordinary. Regardless, from the banal to the future-is-now uses of AI, school divisions are having to consider it all when developing AI governance structures and policies. This presentation will provide an overview of AI governance principles, particularly as it relates to privacy, and proposes a multilayered approach to AI governance in school divisions.

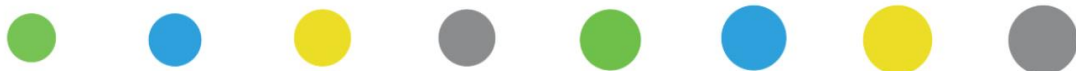
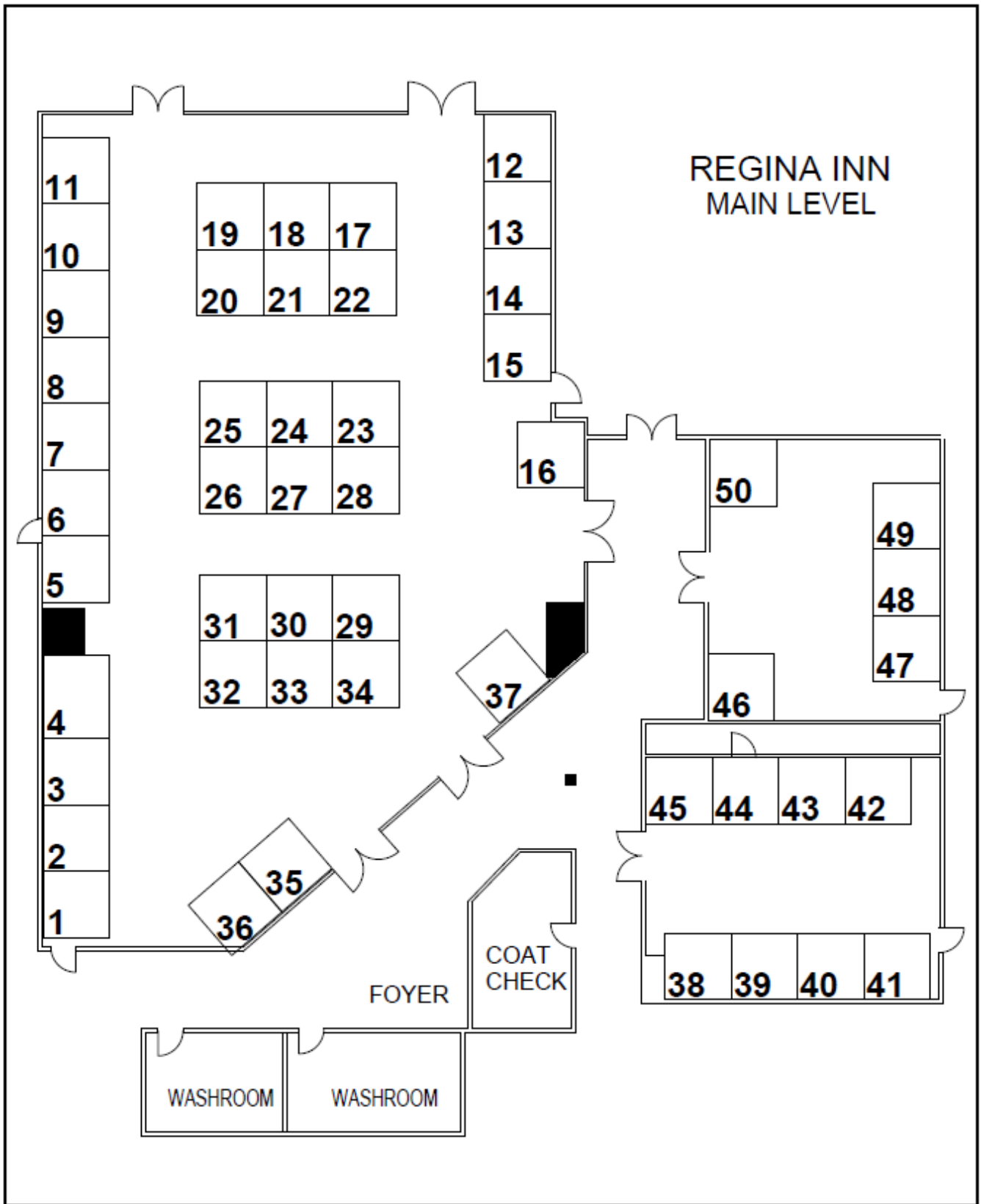

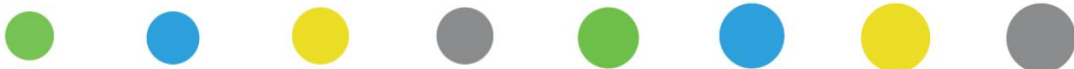
